ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

The COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically changed our way of running the clinic and providing care to our patients. The **International Workshop on Innovations in Delivery of HIV Care**, taking place as a virtual program from 21-22 June, aims to provide an opportunity for presenting changing strategies in the delivery of HIV care. This program will be primarily experienced-based, and supported by state-of-the-art lectures, plenary discussions, and abstract presentations. The workshop will focus on the needs of the patient and how these can be delivered effectively under the increasing constraints and opportunities available within HIV care.

The workshop targets those giving and receiving HIV care. Amongst those are care providers, physicians both in secondary and primary care, nurses, community workers and other care deliverers. The program is developed by an international organizing committee from all areas of HIV care.
