Since its establishment in 2001, AFEW International has championed the rights of all individuals in Eastern Europe and Central Asia (EECA) who confront barriers in accessing health, justice, and social engagement. Our focus has centred on bolstering civil society actors and networks representing underserved communities—those often excluded, stigmatised, facing numerous obstacles hindering their access to essential services and full participation in civic life.

In 2023, we have redoubled our efforts to ensure that our 2023-2025 strategy and programming comprehensively address the adverse effects of the crises on the region's underserved populations.

Our updated strategy focuses on people first, ensuring that underserved populations facing high health risks are the priority. We're committed to tackling the stigma, poverty, discrimination, and exclusion they face. We work closely with communities and civil society organizations in Eastern Europe and Central Asia to develop coordinated responses tailored to their unique needs. These goals are at the core of AFEW International's mission and vision.

In the new strategic cycle 2023-2025, we continue to amplify the international visibility for the needs and rights of underserved populations in the EECA region. Specifically, we concentrate on fortifying the capacities of AFEW International and our partners, refining our collaborative programming in the Eastern Partnership countries and Central Asia. Moreover, we continue fostering resilience and stability in the region by combating stigma and nurturing environments conducive to the well-being of the populations we serve. To facilitate knowledge exchange and mutual learning, we provide platforms and opportunities for communitybased organisations and experts from diverse regional backgrounds, thereby enriching the wider EECA region and neighbouring countries with invaluable insights and expertise.

We strongly believe that, given the evolving needs and crises confronting Eastern Europe and Central Asia, support to this region should once again become a priority for leading international funders, governmental institutions, and private benefactors.

WHO WE ARE

AFEW International is a Dutch-based non-governmental humanitarian public health organisation dedicated to giving support and a strong international voice on rights and on health access to underserved populations in Eastern Europe and Central Asia.

Over the years AFEW International has evolved into a strong civic engagement, humanitarian actor in the EECA region committed to working with local civil society partners to support essential visibility and capacity strengthening efforts in order to ensure continuation of critical health and social services and programming while providing targeted technical and sub-granting funding support.



AFEW INTERNATIONAL SEEKS TO DO THIS BY:

Advocating for human rights for underserved populations and upholding their rights to health;

Building the capacity of civil society actors in the EECA region serving these underserved populations, including operational and financial support;

Presenting the EECA health/rights context at the global level – with international fora, networks and experts;

Facilitating professional and public dialogues at the regional and country level.




AFEW International is working with and for individuals in Eastern Europe and Central Asia region who are stigmatised and discriminated. Together with partners we build the capacity and provide support to civil society actors and advocacy groups and activists representing individuals and communities who have disproportionate burdens of HIV risk and disease and lack of access to quality, lifesaving essential basic health services.

The specific geographic focus for 2023-2025 strategy cycle was selected to be on four Eastern Partnership countries - Armenia, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine, and four Central Asian countries - Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan. Upon urgent needs, AFEW International also works in Europe with individuals who had been displaced from their EECA countries (i.e. Ukrainian refugees in Poland and the Netherlands, Russian political refugees in the Eastern Partnership countries or Europe).



AFEW International has gradually established a partnership of independent local organisations working in the countries of the EECA region. In 2023 the AFEW Partnership consisted of four members operating in **Kazakhstan**, **Kyrgyzstan**, **the Netherlands**, and **Ukraine**, with AFEW International in the Netherlands serving as the international secretariat of the partnership.



Based upon the comprehensive analysis conducted together with its stakeholders, our vision, mission and values, and in consideration of the priorities that AFEW International has identified for the EECA region, the following four transformative strategic objectives for 2023-2025 have been formulated:

GREATER VISIBILITY

for underserved populations' needs and rights related to health in the EECA region, including advocacy and increased resources;

STRENGTHENING PARTNERSHIPS

and partners' capacities on improving health and social protections for underserved populations and communities;

IMPROVING RESILIENCE of communities and addressing the negative consequences of the crisis in Ukraine and the implications for the entire region;

LINKING & LEARNING

through the provision of platforms and opportunities for effective exchanges and access to knowledge to the wider EECA region and neighbourhood countries.

OUR ACHIEVEMENTS: PROJECTS 2023

GREATER VISIBILITY

Following our strategic objective of ensuring greater visibility for underserved populations' needs and rights related to health in the EECA region, including advocacy and increased resources, during the year we have actively engaged with key stakeholders, including by participating in the following **events and activities**:

Europe Day Festival (Tashkent, Uzbekistan), where we together with local partner «Ishonch va Hayot" presented the project "Advocating vulnerable groups' rights through a stronger civil society in Uzbekistan" at the EU-funded projects' fair. The event was organized by the Delegation of the European Union in Uzbekistan.

EECA Health Sustainability Forum (Warsaw, Poland), which aimed to gather national, regional and international partners and to mobilize expertise and experience for the dialogue on priority issues in the changing context of new political, social and economic challenges.

Human Rights Film Festival (The Hague, Netherlands), where we have spoken up about the rights and needs of women in Central Asia at the Human Rights Film Festival organised by Global Human **Rights Defence** (GHRD).





Plenary annual meeting of the Civil Society Forum on Drugs (Brussels, Belgium). The discussions have focused on crucial points, emphasising the necessity to enhance collaboration between civil society and the new European Union Drugs Agency. Enhancing rights and improving health access for underserved populations in Eastern Europe and Central Asia, AFEW International shared experiences on HIV, mental health and Human Rights in the EECA region.



Community-Led Monitoring (CLM) Training which was organized by AIDS Action Europe (Berlin, Germany). The workshop was organized in response to research conducted by AIDS Action Europe, revealing that organizations from Central and Western Europe have not been as deeply involved in community-led monitoring compared to their counterparts in other regions. The event provided invaluable insights into the significance of CLM, its potential applications in community involvement, tools for shadow reporting, and advocacy resources.





Annual Linking Research, **Policy and Practice** Conference, hosted by Share-Net Netherlands (Amsterdam, Netherlands). We facilitated the session «Sexual and **Reproductive Rights and** Inclusion» featuring thoughtprovoking research abstracts by emerging scholars. This annual event provided a platform for knowledge exchange and collaboration in the field of sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) in international development.

COVID-19 SOCIAL MEDIA AWARDS

We co-hosted the COVID-19 Social Media Awards. The COVID-19 Influencers Social Media Awards shined a spotlight on an invaluable array of social media users - all influencers in their own context recognizing the incredible _ they contributions made, and continue to make, to the collective understanding of the pandemic and responses around the world. AFEW International was a co-host of the awards in Eastern Europe and Central Asia. Elena Bilokon, Director of the Revanche Foundation (Kazakhstan) won in the category "Care and Support".

COMBATTING STIGMA TO END HIV/AIDS IN EECA (March 2022 – March 2023)

In 2023 AFEW International has finalized the project "Combatting stigma to end HIV/ AIDS in EECA" (stopstigma.afew.org) including development of the social impact media campaign "See what matters" in 5 languages – Kazakh, Kyrgyz, Russian, Ukrainian and Uzbek – empowering women living with HIV to reduce self-stigma, which has directly benefited over 2000 women in 5 countries and reached over 200.000 people, with financial support of Gilead "Zeroing In: Ending the HIV Epidemic" programme.

In 2023 we worked on strengthening capacity of our partners on improving health and social protections for underserved populations and communities in several countries by implementing the following projects:




EXPANSION AND IMPROVEMENT OF HIV SERVICES IN UZBEKISTAN (May 2021 – April 2023)

AFEW International successfully finalized the project "Expansion and improvement of HIV services in Uzbekistan" in partnership with our local partner NGO "Ischonch va Hayot" (a community-based membership NGO uniting key populations) reaching over 9000 service users, with financial support of the Elton John AIDS Foundation.







ADVOCATING VULNERABLE GROUPS' RIGHTS THROUGH A STRONGER CIVIL SOCIETY IN UZBEKISTAN (February 2022 - August 2024)

We continued to empower underserved groups in Uzbekistan working with 30 CSOs and are organised a series of trainings and activities on Community-Based Participatory Research (CBPR) in Uzbekistan in the framework of the programme "Advocating vulnerable groups' rights through a stronger civil society in Uzbekistan", with financial support from the EU Delegation.

EMPOWERED LGBTI COMMUNITY IN GEORGIA (July – December 2023)





We helped building a more inclusive society in Georgia in the framework of the project "Empowered LGBTI community" in partnership with AIDS Action Europe supported by Deutsche Aidshilfe with funds from the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs under the Expanding Cooperation with Civil Society in the Eastern Partnership Countries and Russia programme.

A final roundtable in Tbilisi provided platform for 15 participants a projects to present their and experiences. The share event included insights from established LGBTI organisations, enhancina participants' understanding and networking opportunities.

IMPROVING RESILIENCE



SUPPORT TO UKRAINIAN PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV IN POLAND (March 2023 – January 2024)

Within the commitment to improve resilience of communities and address the negative consequences of the crisis in Ukraine and the implications for the entire region AFEW International started working in Poland to engage Ukrainian activists currently living there in HIV policy and practice with financial support from the ViiV Healthcare GIPA Accelerator Fund. The project responded to the lack of adequate health system response and engagement of the new and still rising group of PLHIV in Poland – refugees flying from Ukraine due to the war.



Its objective was to increase the equal and full participation of PLHIV refugees from Ukraine in Polish HIV programming, leading to strengthened effective, inclusive and responsive programmes and policies made with the full participation of all PLHIV Ukrainian refugees living in Poland. To achieve this change, we recruited 20 Ukrainian PLHIV refugees willing to become community leaders and self-advocates, provided them with comprehensive trainings covering the essential knowledge and skills and offered them the opportunity to design and implement small-scale initiatives targeted their communities with the support of experienced mentors.

The project successfully completed all activities, including nine tailor-made trainings, mentoring, and group initiatives supporting Ukrainian HIV-positive refugees (PLHIV), PWUD, and LGBT individuals. Implemented by 20 activists in 6 regions of Poland, the project reached over 1,300 PLHIV, with direct outreach to 705 and indirect outreach to 500. Additional outreach included 120 PWUD, 50 LGBT individuals, and 100 from the general population, with over 1,500 views via social media and mentor websites.

Key achievements included a documentary film «Victory Every Day,» a concert with local and regional partners, distribution of informational materials and a Polish-Ukrainian medical phrasebook, and the creation of a platform for Ukrainian women with HIV. The project also facilitated the formation of the HelpNowHub Foundation to ensure ongoing support for Ukrainian PLHIV in Poland. AFEW International and Społeczny Komitet ds. AIDS held a final session in Warsaw, where initiative leaders shared their experiences and received feedback.









LINKING AND LEARNING

We continued providing platforms and opportunities for effective exchanges and access to knowledge to the wider EECA region and neighbourhood countries by (co-)organising the following:

EECA INTERACT

The fourth scientific workshop on HIV, hepatitis C, and tuberculosis in Eastern Europe and Central Asia EECA INTERACT 2023 was held online on 14 December 2023. The live virtual event set the stage for EECA INTERACT 2025, which will be a face-to-face symposium in Fall 2025 that will include oral presentations by young scientists selected through peer review.

Impact of the war on Ukraine and beyond Ukraine across the EECA region;

Prevention in the EECA region and PreP;

SUSTAINABILITY AND THE LONGER-TERM FUTURE

While the donor development landscape is changing rapidly and in unpredictable ways, *AFEW International's* new strategic approach and operational model has already proved to be more relevant, inclusive and sustainable in supporting underserved communities across EECA. *AFEW International* will further pursue its core objectives within the framework of realistic, agile and responsive annual plans.

The strategy is being reviewed using inclusive consultation methods on an annual basis and adapted when needed. This reflects new reality of the current operating landscape where we aim to make an important contribution to both the short and longer term health and other needs of the communities we serve.

Through focusing on the wider needs of underserved population communities and working collaboratively with donors and partners in EECA and at EU level, more strategic partnership opportunities have become available to the organisation:

In 2023, AFEW International became a member of **Funders Concerned About AIDS (FCAA) network**, which provides timely updates and better coordination with donors of different level. Furthermore, FCAA has created a sub-group of donors focusing specifically on the EECA region that have regular calls and meetings to exchange the latest insights and align priorities for funding.

At the end 2023 AFEW of International has been selected via a rigorous application process along with nine other international civil society organisations as a Framework Partner of the European Commission for the Eastern Partnership Countries Moldova, (Armenia, Georgia, Ukraine) and signed the Framework Partnership Agreement for the period of 4 years (2024-2027).

Core focus remains on expanding partners in different countries and continue to bring a 'voice' from EECA region to a pan-European donor and governmental audience, as well as lobbying for recognition and resourcing to address strategic underserved population health risks- leveraging if needed off the current geopolitical spotlight on the region.

In the medium and long term, the ambition remains for AFEW International to be a facilitator of change and exchange between East and West, a strong advocate for human rights and access to healthcare for all, and to raise awareness of and funding for AFEW International and the AFEW Partnership and, in more general terms, for the EECA region civil society actors as a whole.
